

Endemic land birds

still in danger

Some threatened endemic land birds in the granitic Seychelles have made wonderful recovery from the brink of extinction such as the **Seychelles Warbler** and **Seychelles Fody** thanks to **conservation actions**. However, many of them are still in danger. Their conservation status is classified by IUCN, the World Conservation Union. These four endemic birds are still on the IUCN Red List of Threatened Animals. **Critically Endangered (CE)** means that the species is facing an **extremely high risk of extinction** in the wild; **Endangered (EN)** means a very high risk of extinction in the wild.
