STILL IN DANGER

Some threatened endemic land birds in the granitic Seychelles have made a wonderful recovery from the brink of extinction, such as the Seychelles Warbler and Seychelles Fody, thanks to conservation actions. However, many are still in danger. Their conservation status is monitored by IUCN, (the World Conservation Union). These four endemic birds pictured below are still on the IUCN Red List of Threatened Animals. Critically Endangered means that the species is facing an extremely high risk of extinction in the wild; Endangered means a very high risk of extinction in the wild.
